- 10. Conventional vs. alternative medicine.





Location:	Dental surgery	
You:	Dentist	
Patient:	Mr./Mrs. Jackson, a 30-year-old patient presents with a complaint of regular bleeding of her gums and pain while brushing the teeth.	

	TASK
Biodata	<ul> <li>Greet the patient and introduce yourself.</li> <li>Ask about 4 pieces of biodata.</li> <li>Signal that you move on to the chief concern.</li> </ul>
Presenting complaints	<ul> <li>Clarify the nature of the complaint.</li> <li>Enquire about the onset of the complaint.</li> <li>Enquire about the duration of pain.</li> <li>Find out more details about triggering and soothing factors.</li> <li>Signal the end of history taking.</li> </ul>
Past medical history	Ask the patient about previous or chronic diseases: - asthma, allergies - hypertension - stroke, hepatitis - jaundice, epilepsy.
Past dental history	<ul> <li>Find out about the last dental visit.</li> <li>Ask about previous oral dental surgeries.</li> <li>Ask about loss of teeth.</li> <li>Explain the importance of regular visits.</li> </ul>
Social and family history	Ask the patient about: - smoking / alcohol consumption - coffee, tea - complementary therapies used.
Reviewing systems	Ask the patient questions related to the different systems: - respiratory system - cardiovascular problems - gastrointestinal system.
Further steps	<ul> <li>Signal the end of the interview.</li> <li>Summarise what you have learnt about the case.</li> <li>Inform the patient about treatment options (calculus removal/scaling, paradontological treatment, oral hygiene).</li> <li>Ask the patient if he/she has any further questions.</li> <li>Close the interview and arrange an appointment.</li> </ul>
